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Photo 14 attached to the Declaration of Michael R. Eaton and can confirm that it accurately depicts the view New Town residents will have of the Warrenella intersection and BLM Access drive area. For much of the year the high weeds shown in Photo 14 are not present. The area depicted is projected by BLM to handle 150,000 to 250,000 visitors annually. This concentrated addition of 150,000 to 250,000 visitors (and corresponding vehicles) adjacent to New Town/Davenport at a singular parking area/trailhead will greatly interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the New Town/Davenport community members' own lands. I have personally observed regular use of the Warrenella intersection by tractor-trailers for logging, agriculture, ranching, and other purposes. New Town residents will definitely be adversely impacted by the visible and audible activities resulting from the confluence of those activities. Furthermore, the relocated BLM Access driveway directly revealing the southern end of Cement Plant Road as a way to Davenport maximizes the invitation to disturb quiet residential areas such as New Town and put children and adults walking along Cement Plant Road at risk.

- 4. On March 28, 2022 I attended a meeting in the field conducted by BLM Field Manager Ben Blom at the site of BLM's proposed Warrenella Gate Parking Lot for Cotoni-Coast Dairies. The other attendees were Brian McElroy, John Barnes, Noel Bock, Mike Eaton, and Don Croll.
- 5. At that meeting I personally heard Field Manager Blom make the following statements:
 - A. Blom confirmed that funding for the "cheese barn" renovation has been approved and that planning for renovation has been initiated;
 - B. Blom stated that the expected use of the restored barn is for interpretive displays, educational purposes, and special events;

- C. Blom stated that the renovated barn would require a parking lot closer than the planned lot at the top of the knoll and that the likely site for this parking would be the area that the Appellant Davenport North Coast Association has long advanced as a preferred site for parking for trail access;
- D. Blom stated that BLM plans to proceed with construction on the parking lot in June which could be prior to IBLA action on the appeal and noted that Appellants had not asked for a stay pending decision on the appeal.
- E. Blom identified four large trees that will be removed for access to the planned new parking lot on the knoll proposed by BLM;
- F. Blom acknowledged that substantial grading would be required to create the parking lot planned by BLM;
- G. Blom acknowledged that the BLM-preferred Parking Lot and its Access would have a visual impact on residents of New Town Davenport and be visible from much of the Monument land;
- H. Blom described BLM's intention to provide a visual screen between Warrenella Road and the parking lot;
- I. In response to a question, Blom acknowledged that the very close proximity of the Access to the Parking Lot and the Warrenella gate would make it more difficult to control bicycle access to Warrenella, a private road, and to closed areas of the Monument via Warrenella.
